Summary

In response to the growing arts and cultural sector within our community and Burwood's planned <u>Urban</u> <u>Park | Arts and Cultural Centre</u>, Council held the Burwood Arts and Cultural Forum at the Burwood Library and Community Hub on Thursday 25 August 2022.

The purpose of the forum was to:

- Connect with local organisations and groups currently working on arts and cultural initiatives or with a desire to do so in the near future;
- Share information about a range of upcoming Council-led arts and cultural projects and emerging opportunities with artists, arts professionals, community organisations and groups; and
- Hear from participants about how Council can best work with local organisations and better support arts and cultural activity in the local area.

A total of 24 people made up of local artists, arts industry professionals and representatives of community organisations involved or interested in arts and cultural projects and initiatives participated in the forum. Participants represented a broad range of CALD and diverse faith communities as well as multi- artforms and practice.

In the lead up to the forum an online survey was also made available to arts and cultural organisations to help gain a better understanding of groups operating within the local area. A total of 13 unique surveys were completed by arts and cultural organisations, including some organisations that were not able to attend the forum.

Key findings from the forum and organisation survey indicate:

- There is an emerging vision and appetite for Burwood to be a centre for arts and culture with
 opportunities to participate in or access diverse artforms, ranging from accessible exhibitions and
 workshops to unique music performances and cultural festivals. This vision is underpinned by a
 desire to build stronger connections across the local arts and cultural sector, establish links with
 local business and improve access to purpose built spaces that support the growth of arts and
 culture.
- Forum participants identified multiple opportunities to grow arts and culture in Burwood, notably by capturing local stories and promoting local cultural assets, increasing the number of exhibitions and events, expanding public art beyond the Burwood Town Centre and improving access to spaces that enable collaboration, community connection, performance or the display of artworks.
- Key support needs of local organisations included: Support in accessing funding, including
 assistance in preparing grant applications; Promotion and marketing support for community led
 arts and cultural initiatives; Facilitating new networking opportunities; Support in planning
 community events; and more venues for more diverse activities, including art workshops,
 exhibitions, events, maker or residency spaces that are free or low cost.

• Forum participants saw there was a need for Council to play a leadership role in addressing the above support needs and also in facilitating more effective opportunities for building local networks and connections between groups and communities.

Overall, the majority of participant feedback was supportive of Council's current direction in increasing support for arts and cultural development in Burwood. It is clear, however, that additional work is required to connect those working in the arts and cultural sector to one another as well as future opportunities to work in partnership with Council.

The forum and organisation survey findings will be utilised to identify further opportunities for collaboration and to help determine how Council can best support and work with the local arts and cultural sector. These preliminary findings will also inform the development of the future Burwood Cultural Plan and further planning in relation to the future operation and programming at the Burwood Arts and Cultural Centre.

Burwood Council would like to thank all members of the community who participated in this community engagement process and continue to provide valuable input into the advancement of arts and culture in Burwood.



- Tailored public programs to activate the exhibition








Burwood Arts and Culture Organisation Survey Data

Council invited local arts and cultural organisations to participate in an online survey on <u>Participate</u> <u>Burwood</u> from 12 August to 2 September 2022. The purpose of the organisation survey was to help gain a better understanding of groups operating within the local area who are actively contributing to the development of arts and culture along with some initial insights into their support needs.

The following presents a summary of the survey data.

Survey participants included a total of 13 organisations, including:

How can Council better support your organisation in achieving its goals?

We've got best support from Council. If we could, we would like to have exhibition and international exchange to get more ideas and vision from outside Burwood or Australia.

We value the opportunities to discuss our ideas and plans with Burwood Council staff and to explore ways for further benefits. We are interested in community grants programs. We are also very interested in learning about the technology that is planned for the Arts and Community Centre and how we may be able to utilise these.

Support by provide grants, discounted rates. Keep us informed so that we know when we can act properly for the right group.

Host free workshops in the community centre and other council facilities; Have a screen regularly showing children's original artworks in the council facilities; Collect children's original artworks, and display in the 3D museum video and on the 3D-frame robot; Host art exhibitions to show children's original artworks and animations.

More assistance with promotion of Woodstock events. Financial assistance in order for us to spend more on our marketing. Continued reduced rates for venue hire. Introductions to businesses within the area who could partner with us. Provide opportunities to create new work that includes the local community that strives for innovation, collaboration and inclusion, marketing support and residency space (for new projects).

Help us to build bridges with broad communities in Burwood. We're happy to organise events engaging the Muslim community.

Financial contributions and publicity.

Promotion of art and culture; and provide more council venues for more activities.

Financial support and advertising.

I would like to talk to council staff who organise workshops for adults, seniors and teens and see what would be of interest to teach here. I have moved here 1 1/2 years ago but not taught in Burwood yet. Also to talk to people who support your own staff to explain how a meditative drawing workshop can lower stress levels and reward staff for hard work! I'd like to know the local venues available for workshops and costs. and payment terms for workshops taught through council.

If Council is still making its facilities available and COVID has receded enough by next year we may be able to recommence.
